Bringing Change From the Inside

HMP Cardiff – Give thanks that the Christianity Explored course is going well. Please pray for these men that God would enable them to really understand the gospel. Pray also for God to be working in the hearts of the next group, who are yet to be raised up. Also continue to pray for David and Gillian as they run these courses.

Please continue to pray for the men who did CE before Christmas and are still involved in other courses and Bible studies, that they will continue to explore Christianity and respond, and that their faith will be true and living.

HMP Eastwood Park – Give thanks that the CE course is going really well, with about 12 women attending, who are really enjoying it and giving good feedback to the chaplain. Please pray for Lindsay and Gillian as they run the course and for the women as they hear the gospel and respond to it in varying degrees, that they will be convicted of their sinfulness and their need for Jesus. Please pray for relationships within the group to be supportive and loving and to reach outside the group, and for the opportunity to run the course again.

HMP Oakwood – A team of 9 went into Oakwood recently. Give thanks for the number of people who are keen to be involved in the ministry every week.

Several key figures in the Bible study group at Oakwood have been moved on to other prisons. Please pray that they might continue to seek the Lord and that they may be a blessing to others in their new surroundings. Also pray that others might join the Bible study group.

HMP Swansea – Please pray that we will be able to start a new CE course in Swansea.

Crowborough PSG - James has had a difficult time since being released under strict licence conditions to a hostel in November. Give thanks for answered prayer: he can now attend church, has somewhere to live and a likely job in the offing. He writes, "God has doubly blessed me and I am very thankful for praying friends."

Norwich PSG – Please pray for a group of prisoners who have an African background and are professing Christians. Pray that they will be a real help to each other and that the preaching will be used for good in their lives.

Gift Aid -

I am a UK taxpayer. Please treat this gift, all gifts I have made in the last four years and all future gifts as Gift Aid. I confirm I have paid or will pay an amount of Income Tax and/or Capital Gains Tax for each tax year (6 April to 5 April) that is at least equal to the amount of tax that all the charities or Community Amateur Sports Clubs (CASCS) that I donate will reclaim on my gifts for that tax year. I understand that other taxes such as VAT and Council Tax do not qualify. I understand the charity will reclaim 25p of tax on every £1 that I give on or after 6 April 2008.

Bible Study –A successful Bible study group at a Midlands prison had to end because of regime changes. There is now a glimmer of hope that it might be resumed. Please pray that the governors will value the work as a positive experience for the prisoners and allow them time off their prison work to attend.

Lance – Give thanks for a dramatic change in Lance. He is a young offender serving a long sentence. His responses to questions and a change of attitude suggest he has become a Christian. Please pray that the change in him might bear the fruits of a true believer. His difficult background requires lots of prayer if he is to go on in the Christian life.

Peter – Please pray for Peter, an Afro-Caribbean man serving a long sentence. He is now in his late fifties and feels he has wasted his life after rejecting his Christian upbringing, but now wants to return to the Lord.

Prison - Please pray for a prison where we have had regular involvement for some time. The new chaplain is complaining about the biblical emphasis of Daylight's services, preferring the musical entertainment that some other groups provide or vague platitudes in a brief talk, which have minimal gospel content.

Simon – Please pray for Simon, a close relative of one of our supporters, who has recently been sentenced. There are great concerns about his state of mind. He started attending an evangelical church after he was charged. Please pray for his family too at this time.
