Jonny has been coming along to one of our weekly Bible study groups for the past five years. Knowing he was due to be released the following week, at his last session we asked him to share his testimony with the other men.

He spoke about committing his crime six years ago and then going on the run for several months. Feeling he couldn't face prison or continue to run, he was moments from taking his life when someone pulled him back and persuaded him to give himself up. Jonny became a Christian in prison and has hardly missed a Bible study session over the years he has been there. We have seen him grow in grace and spiritual understanding and he has now become a really mature believer.

Please pray that Jonny will continue to know the Lord's presence and leading in his life after release and that the church he is attending will support and encourage him in his Christian walk.

One of our prison teams is giving thanks for answered prayer at a recent service in HMP Ford. Various members of the team took part, with one giving their testimony and another bringing a clear message from 2 Corinthians 5:14-21. They were encouraged by having a good number of prisoners who listened and sang well.

During a time for refreshments after the service, the team had the opportunity to speak to individual prisoners and had a number of profitable conversations. Please pray that the message these men heard would be used to speak to them and that they will read the books and other literature they were given.

HMYOI Deerbolt (County Durham) – Please pray for the young men who will be attending a Bible study due to start in the near future.

Hebron Church (Stockton-On-Tees) – Give thanks for the opportunity John Little had to speak here recently. Please pray for the church as they meet former prisoners through their food bank, Bible study and Sunday services.

Mack – Please continue to pray for Mack who has now been transferred to another prison prior to his release in a couple of months. Please pray that links may be forged with a good, supportive church in the North East.

Opportunities – Give thanks for potential opportunities in two new prisons and for volunteers willing to take these up. Please pray that good relationships will be established with the chaplains and that these opportunities will lead to regular ministry in these prisons.

HMP Portland (Dorset) – Please pray for the Christianity Explored course which began at the end of June and will be running in place of the regular Bible study for seven weeks. Pray that many will join the course and that the Gospel of Jesus will be clearly understood.

Saul – Please pray for Saul, a prisoner from a traveller background who has clearly been saved. He is being confused by relatives who are trying to pressurise him into returning to his old religion. Please pray that he will be helped to fully trust in the teaching of the Bible.

Scotland – Give thanks that we are now able to do a Christianity Explored course with the Protection Group who seem eager to attend and learn from the course. Please pray that they will greatly benefit from studying the Gospel of Mark and will come to a saving knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ.

Pray too for the two weekly services, that God's Word would be richly blessed to all who attend these services.

Security Clearance – Please pray for our staff and volunteers renewing their security clearance, that these checks would be completed quickly and not cause delays in running Bible studies and courses.
